# District Update (R. Machesky)

- <u>Challenges Faced -</u> A little over a year dealing with Covid, and return to learn plan has been a challenge. Transitioned and worked on a robust hybrid platform with a goal to put students fully in seat. Moving in that direction and getting closer thinking about next year. Appreciate the patience. Thank you for the hard work from principals and teachers. Enrollment was a challenge 300-400 students less, with a large number of Kindergarteners not enrolled and delaying a year. District is working diligently to bring those students back in order to keep district funding. District did bring back all of the staff, including support staff.
- <u>Strategic plan-</u> We are proud of the fact learning is key at all levels for staff, and we've been able to leverage our university partnership with elementary and middle school with the Teacher's college. Continue to seek opportunities to leverage more in middle school. Deepening learning has been quite the challenge this year, but leveraging digital. 1:1 for K-12.
- 3. Schoology management system was utilized as a communication tool with families across the district. Virtual field trips and speakers. Most importantly, we are focusing on high end curriculum.
- 4. <u>Inclusion is a priority</u> What is important for students to know? Inclusion was set aside because of the pandemic. Fall and winter- inclusion was brought back to the forefront. Equity survey was sent out and greatly appreciate parent feedback.
- 5. Attending to the well being of all students-Attendance rates have been outstanding! Reinstituting the numbers of counselors and social workers at the high school level.

- 6. Early Childhood goal for 2020 coming to Kindergarten with a preschool experience. 93% came with this experience in 2019. We have room for growth. As it grows, we hope the community takes advantage of the preschool program.
- What to expect next year- Let us know if you want your child to return in seat. Deadline is 3-23-21 for after spring break. Looking at what our classrooms will look like for next year. Trying to get a general idea moving forward. Survey within the next week or so.
- 8. <u>What will virtual look like?</u> Next year we will have a separate virtual campus. Teachers will not be teaching from school and on virtual. Hybrid teaching will end. Roomies and zoomies will be separate next year and will have different teachers.
- 9. <u>Community input</u>-The district values the input families provide. We listen and make important decisions from what we hear from you. As we move forward in the strategic plan, your feedback will be important moving forward. Parents are asked to answer the questions:
  - What's going well?
  - What do we need to improve?
  - What other things do you want us to know?
